PROGRAM SUMMARY:

At the forefront of innovation and design, architects hold the blueprint to shape our future landscapes. Our collective vision transcends mere structures; it envisions spaces that inspire, uplift, and endure. Together, let us lead forward with purpose, vision, and unwavering determination, as we sculpt a future where innovation knows no bounds.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES:

- 1. Reimagine Public Space + our role as Architects.
- 2. Discover your leadership style + opportunities.
- 3. Strategize effective leadership qualities and responsibilities.
- 4. Spark creative thinking + purpose.

PROGRAM ABSTRACT:

In CKLDP Session #01, participants embark on a journey of purpose and self-discovery, delving into an introspective review of their identities as both individuals, teams and leaders. Through a process of self-reflection, we assess our strengths and weaknesses while emphasizing the pivotal role of communication and emotional intelligence within a team framework. Central to our discussions are probing inquiries: What qualities distinguish exceptional leaders? What responsibilities do we bear as leaders? How can we enhance our team's effectiveness? Which characteristics do we aspire to emulate? Participants engage in qualitative self-analysis, contributing to a dynamic curriculum featuring presentations, dialogues, and interactive exercises aimed at fostering personal growth and insight.

First, scholars will hear a motivational presentation about Reimagining Public Space that focuses on the role of function in architecture and opportunities to shape the social fabric. Images are geared to spark critical thinking and discourse as a group.

Secondly, a Leadership Panel will include leaders with different levels of experience and involvement in the community. A dynamic conversation will highlight themes including identity, purpose, inspiration, opportunities, legacy and career growth. Scholars are encouraged to engage with the panel and ask questions.

Next, an interactive workshop allows scholars to work with each other in small groups to identify their passions, effective leadership qualities and styles. Groups will reconvene at the end of this session to discuss what they learned.

To conclude, the next act unveils the outcomes of a Lifestyle Inventory conducted earlier by Cable Clarke of Clarke Consultants, shedding light on our cognitive and behavioral patterns and their impact on performance and group dynamics, thus illuminating our unique leadership styles.

Presentation #3: Leadership Lab

What does it look like to define your personal brand of leadership? How can you learn to flex your leadership muscle in your professional and personal life? How can you build agency to apply those skills and affect long-term impact? How do you identify those around you who can build into you while you build into others? This session will explore these and more questions through a series of charrettes designed to help you identify your passions, your skill set, and how to apply them to your career in architecture.

Many architects, regardless of career stage, find themselves working through inefficiencies and mis-application of their individual skill set, leading to frustration, burn-out, and departure from the profession. This paradigm is exacerbated by the difficulty of identifying quality mentors who are interdependently invested over the long term. This session will guide participants to identify their passions and distinguish how they are uniquely wired to lead in the practice of architecture, while also exploring how learned skills and capabilities inform their individual "lane" of practice.
